What is harmful gambling?



438,000 estimated people experience some form of gambling harm in Aotearoa.



Associated with a wide range of co-existing health issues, addiction and increased suicide risk.



On average, six people are affected by someone experiencing gambling harm.



How much per year?

\$2.792 billion \$


2023/24 (year to 30 June) summary stats across the four main types of gambling in Aotearoa:

- TAB racing and sports gambling: \$371 million
- Casinos: \$592 million
- Gambling Machines outside casinos: \$1,037 billion
- NZ Lotteries: \$792 million

Growth of Online Gambling



- 31.1% of all gambling is taking place online
- 11% of people accessing support are citing offshore gambling sites
- Current online gambling is more harmful than in venue gambling as lacks regulation, host responsibility rules and exclusion options
- Coming is up to 15 more licenced online casinos to enter the market without consumer protections





Gambling Harm Strategy 25/26 and 26/27



Government Priority Outcomes

GOAL: New Zealanders' quality of life and life expectancy are not affected by gambling harm



- Increasing access to gambling harm support
- Growing the gambling harm workforce
- Strengthening the focus on the prevention of and early intervention in gambling harm
- Improving the effectiveness of gambling harm support

- Self regulation of Loot boxes on gaming products


